

Fall Festival of Roses
Rose Show Schedule
Please read carefully

1. Entries will be received from 6:00 a.m. until 10:00 a.m. Saturday, October 7, 2006 and must remain in place until Sunday, October 8, 2005 at 3:30 p.m.
2. Everyone is welcome to enter exhibits in this show as long as roses were grown in his or her own outdoor garden. One exhibitor or a team from any one garden may enter any class for which they are qualified; however, more than one entry of the same variety from the same garden in any one class will disqualify each.
3. Exhibitors must register their name and full address with the Registration Clerk. Envelopes will be available for those exhibitors that would like their entry tags returned to them.
4. Approved ARS entry tags must be used. Complete only the upper half of the tag including name and full address. Use ordinary pens, blue or black ink; stamps or name labels. NO FELT PENS. Close entry tags.
5. All vases will be furnished.
6. Classification of all roses will be in accordance with 'The Official List of Approved Exhibition Names', 'The Handbook for Selecting Roses', 'Modern Roses 11' as modified in ARS publications prior to the date of the show and 'The Combined Rose List'. However, where differences occur, ARS publications will take precedence.
7. Queen, King, and Princess of Show will be selected from Class 1. Mini-Flora Queen, King and Princess will be selected from class 20. Miniature Queen, King and Princess of Show will be selected from Class 15. A Court of Honor of six entries will be selected from Class 1 and Class 15.
8. In challenge classes, only one entry per exhibitor.
9. Specimen judges judging this show must enter the Judges' Challenge classes only with the exception of Class 35.
10. Wedges & supports will be allowed.
11. Only blue or first place winners are eligible to win trophies. ARS Certificates will be awarded where applicable.
12. Specimens need not be registered to be exhibited but must have an ARS approved exhibition name. However, please be aware of the

following reasons for disqualification:

- a. Misnamed, misclassified, unlabeled, mislabeled.
- b. Stem on stem, except Old Garden Roses and Shrubs.
- c. The presence of a foreign substance applied to the foliage, stem or bloom to improve the appearance of the specimen.
- d. Sidebuds on specimens that must be disbudded.
- e. A specimen in violation of ARS rules or local society rules applying to this show.
- f. The appearance of the exhibitor's name in any location other than that designated on the entry tag.
- g. A rose not listed in an ARS-approved publication.

13. The decisions of the judges are final.

14. In the Judges' Class, any number of entries will be allowed, however, only one variety per person or household will be permitted.

15. The show committee will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of exhibits and properties. Armstrong Garden Centers or the Flower Fields cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss.

16. Trophies will be awarded on Saturday, October 7, 2006 at 2:00 p.m. All winners must be present for their acceptance or make specific arrangements for their acceptance.

Hybrid Teas and Grandifloras

Class 1. One hybrid tea or grandiflora bloom without sidebuds.

Queen of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Gold Certificate

King of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Silver Certificate

Princess of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Bronze Certificate

Court of Honor

Six superior entries to be selected from Class 1.

Class 2. Three hybrid tea or grandiflora blooms without sidebuds. One variety in one container.

Award: Trophy

Class 3. Six hybrid tea or grandiflora blooms without sidebuds. One variety in one container.

Award: Trophy

Class 4. One fully open hybrid tea or grandiflora bloom without sidebuds. Stamens must be visible.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 5. One hybrid tea or grandiflora spray.

a. One hybrid tea spray. Must have two or more blooms.

Award: ARS Certificate

b. One grandiflora spray. Must have two or more blooms.

Award: ARS Certificate

Trophy will be awarded for the best in Class 6.

Section B

Floribundas and Polyanthas

Class 6. One floribunda bloom without sidebuds.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 7. One floribunda spray. Must have two or more blooms.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 8. Three floribunda sprays. One variety in one container.

Award: Trophy

Class 9. One polyantha spray.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Section C

Old Garden Roses

All entries must include date and horticultural classification on entry tags

Class 10. One Old Garden Rose with or without sidebuds or one spray. Introduced prior to 1867, including roses of unknown date which were known to have existed prior to 1867.

Award: Trophy and ARS Dowager Queen Certificate

Class 11. One Old Garden Rose with or without side buds or one spray. Introduced in 1867 or after or with unknown date of origin after 1867. No species.

Award: Trophy and ARS Victorian Certificate

Section D

Shrubs

Class 12. One bloom or spray of any modern shrub that does not have a family connection but is designated in ARS publications as (S).

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 13. One bloom or spray of any 'Austin' or 'English' rose.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Section E

Climbing Roses

Class 14. One bloom or spray of any Large-flowered Climber or Hybrid Wichurana.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Section F

Miniature and Mini-Flora

Class 15. One miniature bloom without sidebuds.

Miniature Queen of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Gold Certificate

Miniature King of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Silver Certificate

Miniature Princess of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Bronze Certificate

Court of Honor

Six superior entries to be selected from Class 15.

Class 16. Three miniature or mini-flora blooms without sidebuds. One variety in one container.

Award: Trophy

Class 17. One miniature or mini-flora spray.

No single (5-12 petals) varieties.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 18. One miniature single (5-12 petals) variety without sidebuds.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 19. One fully open miniature or mini-flora blossom without sidebuds. Stamens must be showing. No single (5-12 petals) varieties.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 20. One mini-flora bloom without sidebuds.

Mini-Flora Queen of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Gold Certificate

Mini-Flora King of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Silver Certificate

Mini-Flora Princess of Show

Award: Trophy and ARS Bronze Certificate

Section G

English Boxes

Class 21. Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora English Box.

Six blooms of one variety.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 22. Floribunda English Box. One variety.

Award: Trophy

Class 23. Shrub English Box. One variety.

Award: Trophy

Class 24. Miniature English Box. One variety.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Section H

Single Roses

Roses that only present flowers with 5 to 12 petals

Class 25. One spray of a single rose. No miniatures.

Award: Trophy

Class 26. One spray of a miniature single rose.
Award: Trophy

Section I

Cycle of Bloom

Class 27. Three hybrid tea or grandiflora blooms without sidebuds. One bud with sepals down, one bloom at exhibition stage and one bloom fully open with the stamens showing. One variety in one container.
Award: Trophy

Class 28. Three miniature or mini-flora blooms without sidebuds. One bud with sepals down, one bloom at exhibition stage and one bloom fully open with the stamens showing. One variety in one container.
Award: Trophy

Section J

Miscellaneous Roses

Class 29. Most Fragrant Rose. One bloom or spray. Judged 60% on fragrance and 40% on general excellence.
Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 30. One bloom or spray of any seedling hybridized or a sport discovered by the exhibitor. Include parent, if known, on the entry tag. No roses under test numbers are eligible.
Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 31. Child's Entry. Open to children under 16 years of age. One bloom or spray of any rose. Rose must be grown in the child's family garden but must be selected and groomed by the entrant. There is no limit to the number of entries.
Award: Trophy

Section K

Challenge Classes

Exhibitors may place their own entries

Class 32. What A Sport! A rose and its sport. Three blossoms or sprays exhibited in one container. (i.e. Lynn Anderson and Crowd Pleaser; Bees Knees and Arin Alonso; New Zealand and Full Sail.) There is no limit to the number of entries.
Award: Trophy

Class 33. The John S. Armstrong Challenge Class. One bloom shown without sidebuds and showing exhibition form. Open to any of the following varieties: Carol Burnett, Baronne Edmund de Rothschild, Della Reese, Dolores Hope, Julie Newmar, Plum Crazy, Anastasia, Modern Art, Silverado, Joshua Bradley or Katherine Loker.

Award: Trophy

Class 34. The Charlotte Armstrong Challenge Class. One spray of any of the following varieties: Katherine Loker, Paul Ecke, Jr., Route 66, City of Carlsbad, City of San Francisco, City of San Diego, John-John or Tootsie.

Award: Trophy

Class 35. The All-America Rose Selections Challenge Class. One bloom or spray of any AARS-winning variety.

Award: Trophy

Class 36. Rose in a Bowl. One hybrid tea or grandiflora bloom showing exhibition form and exhibited in a bowl. No foliage permitted and blossom must be floating with peduncle not touching the bottom of the bowl.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 37. Big and Little Look-A-Likes. One hybrid tea or grandiflora and one miniature bloom each of the same type (exhibition or single), exhibited in separate containers.

Award: Trophy

Section L

Novice Classes

Open only to exhibitors that have never won a trophy in an ARS-accredited show.

Class 38. One hybrid tea or grandiflora bloom
without sidebuds.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 39. One floribunda bloom or spray.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 40. One miniature bloom without sidebuds.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Section M

Judges' Classes

Open only to judges who are judging this show.

Class 41. One hybrid tea or grandiflora bloom without sidebuds.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 42. One floribunda bloom or spray or one polyantha spray.

Award: Trophy and ARS Certificate

Class 43. One miniature bloom without sidebuds.

Class 44. One bloom or spray of an old garden rose.

Class 45. One bloom or spray of any shrub rose.
