

Division II - Arrangements Rules

Arrangements Score Card (all classes)

Conformance - 15 points

- a. Naming of roses
- b. Conformance to type of design
- d. Other specific requirements of schedule

Design - 30 Points

Balance, dominance, contrast, rhythm, proportion, scale

Perfection of the Rose(s) - 30 point

Including condition of other plant material

Creativity and Expressiveness - 15 points

Distinction - 10 Points

Unique, sets the design apart, superiority in every respect, includes technical execution/construction.

1. All roses must be outdoor garden grown and of high quality.
 2. Roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements.
 3. Roses must be correctly named and listed on entry tag.
 4. AG should be written on the entry tag if roses are arranger grown so the entry will be eligible for a medal certificate.
 5. Only Miniature and Mini-Florals may be used in miniature designs.
 6. One entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class, but an exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired.
 7. Accessories and flowers other than roses and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule.
 8. A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the Arrangers interpretation of the theme or class title.
 9. An arrangement incorrectly placed will be judged in the class in which it is placed.
 10. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
 11. No one but the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement. However, in extreme circumstances, if all efforts to locate the arranger have failed, the arrangement chairman may carefully move an arrangement
 12. The East County Rose Society or Foothills Adult School will not be responsible for exhibits. Your participation is welcomed and care for your arrangements will be provided to the best of the society's ability. It cannot, however, assume any responsibility for any loss or damage to property.
 13. Reservations are required for all arrangements. Reservations will close Thursday, October 12. Please phone Frank or Lila Hastings 619-444-2552 for space reservations.
 14. Arrangements must be in place and ready for judging by 9:45am on Saturday.
 15. Some roses will be available at the show Saturday morning on a first-come, first-served basis.
 16. Care should be exercised when preparing arrangements in the show area. ALL WATER AND TRASH IN YOUR AREA MUST BE CLEANED UP!
 17. Trophies will be given out at 3:45pm.
 18. All arrangements must be left in place until 4:00 pm.

Disqualifications:

1. Roses not outdoor grown.
2. Use of artificial plant materials.

Penalty: 1. Painted or dyed fresh plant material or use of live creatures are not allowed. 2. Use of plant material on state conservation list not permitted 3. Use of any country flags are not permitted.

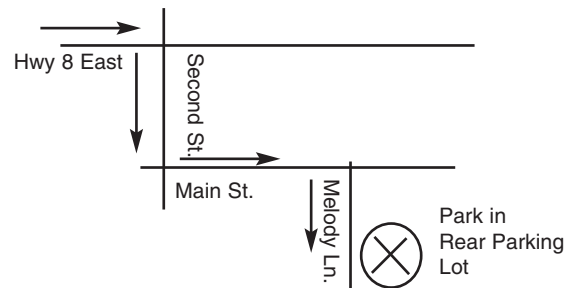

Division I Show Rules

1. This show schedule has been prepared under the guidelines of the American Rose Society and will follow ARS rules and regulations.
2. Judging will be in accordance with current Guidelines for Judging Roses. The judges decisions are final.
3. Classification of roses will be in accordance with the latest edition of *Modern Roses II*, *Exhibitors Handbook for Selecting Roses*, *Combined Rose List*, or the New Rose Registration in the American Rose magazine. All roses must be exhibited under the ARS Exhibition names as listed in bold type in the *ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses*. A rose variety need not be registered with the ARS to be exhibited in this show, but must be listed in ARS recognized publications. ARS publications take priority over *Combined Rose List*.
4. Each exhibitor must be registered and use an official ARS entry tag. Only ARS entry tags may be used. Complete ONLY the upper half of the tag including name and address. Use blue or black pen. (No felt tips please.)
5. The preparation area will be open at 6:00am and entries will close promptly at 9:45am. Judging to start at 10:00 am.
6. To enter the ECRS challenge classes (Section A, Classes 1-5), exhibitors must be current members of the ECRS as of 9/1/06.
7. This is an alphabetically arranged show with each variety constituting a separate class.
8. Specimen roses must have been grown in the exhibitor's outdoor, private garden.
9. Wedging materials may be used with the exception of PLASTIC WRAP. If wedging materials protrude above the vase, the specimen will be penalized according to the degree of distraction.
10. Only one exhibitor or team from one garden may enter any one class. More than one entry of the same variety from the same garden in any one class will disqualify all such entries.
11. Containers will be furnished on a first-come, first-served basis by the ECRS except where otherwise specified.
12. The placement committee will place all roses except for challenge classes and the Floating Bowl (Class 12). No unauthorized people are allowed in the show area.
13. Judges and members of their families may not enter roses except in classes 36-39.
14. ARS rules governing disqualification will be strictly adhered to, including misnamed, misplaced, misclassified, mislabeled or unlabeled, stem-on-stem (except old garden roses and shrubs), side buds, presence of a foreign substance, entries in violation of ARS or show rules, or without an approved exhibition name.
15. Neither Foothills Adult School or the ECRS will be liable for any loss or damage. All entries become the property of the society.
16. Trophies will be awarded Saturday at 3:45pm. Winners should be present to accept awards or make arrangements for someone else to pick up their trophies.



Division I - Horticulture

Section A - Challenge Classes

Classes 1-5 East County Members Only

- Class 1 George Johnson Memorial Trophy**
A mixed bouquet of 9 - 12 stems of 3 or more varieties. Use any combination of roses in ONE container. Judging to be on overall mass effect. (Exhibitor to supply container.)

- Class 2 Luis Desamero Trophy**
Stages of Bloom—Miniature specimens of the same cultivar showing 3 stages of development: 1 bud (petals unfurling), 1 bloom (approximately 1/2 open or at its most perfect phase of beauty), and one fully open bloom (stamens visible). Displayed in ONE container. Perpetual Trophy & Keeper
- Class 3 East County Trophy**
A bouquet of 6 to 9 stems of modern shrubs exhibited in one container provided by society.

- Class 4 Betty Dow - Lovely Lady Trophy**
3 fully open roses of the same variety.

- Class 5 Gerry Dow Trophy**
3 stems of shrubs and/or old garden roses. Displayed in one container.

- Class 6 Martha Epler Memorial Trophy**
Stages of Bloom—Hybrid Tea specimens of the same cultivar showing 3 stages of development: 1 bud (petals unfurling), 1 bloom (approximately 1/2 open or at its most perfect phase of beauty), and one fully open bloom (stamens visible). Displayed in ONE container. - Perpetual Trophy & Keeper
- Class 7 Coe Applegate Memorial Trophy**
3 Floribunda Sprays - same variety (except single 4-8 petals). Displayed in separate containers.

- Class 8 Jean Kenneally Memorial Trophy**
Look-a-Like/Hi-Lo Class
1 H.T., G.F., or FL. exhibition form bloom and 1 miniature or mini-flora exhibition form bloom shown in separate containers. Blooms to have similar form, color, and appearance.

- Class 10 3 Blooms - One Bloom per Stem**
Exhibition form of the same variety displayed in ONE container. Trophy

Exhibition Form all the same variety displayed in ONE container. Trophy
- Class 12 Floating Bowl**
1 Bloom. Exhibition Form. No foliage, no stem, container provided. Trophy & Certificate
- Class 13 English Box- Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora**
Any combination of varieties or all one variety. Exhibition form without foliage. (Sepals are permitted). Trophy & Certificate
- Class 14 Rose in a Picture Frame**
Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora - 1 bloom. Exhibition Form. Use of foliage is optional. Frame provided by ECRS. **1 entry per exhibitor.** Trophy
- Class 15 H.T. Spray or Cluster**
Trophy & Cert.

- Class 16 1 bloom per stem Floribunda** Trophy & Cert.

1 Bloom Per Stem. Exhibition Form. Eligible for:

- Class 20 3 Mini Blooms - 1 bloom per stem.**
Exhibition form, one variety. Displayed in ONE container. Trophy
- Class 21 1 Mini Spray** Trophy & Certificate
- Class 22 1 Single Mini (4-8 petals).** Trophy
- Class 23 Fully Open**
Stamens must be visible. No single petal varieties. Trophy

- Class 24 Mini or Mini Flora English Box**
Any combination of varieties or all one variety. Exhibition form without foliage. Sepals are permitted. Certificate & Trophy
- Class 25 Mini or Mini Flora in a Picture Frame**
1 bloom. Exhibition Form. Use of foliage is optional. Frame provided by the ECRS.
1 entry per exhibitor. Trophy
- Class 26 Artist's Palette**
An entry of 5 different varieties of mini or mini-flora roses without foliage, arranged in an artistic display of color. One entry per exhibitor. Trophy

Section E - Old Garden Roses

- Class 27 Genesis** - 1 bloom or spray of any type Old Garden rose, designated as "SP" in ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses. ARS Certificate and Trophy
- Class 28 Dowager** - Any variety of rose except Species (SP) in existence prior to 1867, 1 bloom or spray. Date of Introduction must appear on tag. No Species. ARS Certificate and Trophy
- Class 29 Victorian** - Any variety of rose in existence 1867 or after, 1 bloom or spray. No Species. Date of Introduction must appear on tag. ARS Certificate and Trophy

Section F - Shrubs & Climbers

- Class 30 Modern Shrub - one bloom** 1 bloom with or without side buds. Certificate & Trophy
- Class 31 Modern Shrub - one spray** - 2 or more blooms with or without side buds. Trophy & Certificate
- Class 32 Classic Shrub Rose - One Bloom or Spray** - (Those roses with family designations such as HRg, HMsK, HKar, and Hmoy.) Trophy & Certificate
- Class 33 Climber.** One bloom or spray. LCL or WHich. Trophy & Certificate

Section G - Miscellaneous

- Class 34 Most Fragrant**
1 stem. Judged 70% for fragrance and 30% for general excellence. Trophy & Certificate
- Class 35 Fully Opened**
1 bloom (except miniatures) Stamens must be showing. Trophy & Certificate.
