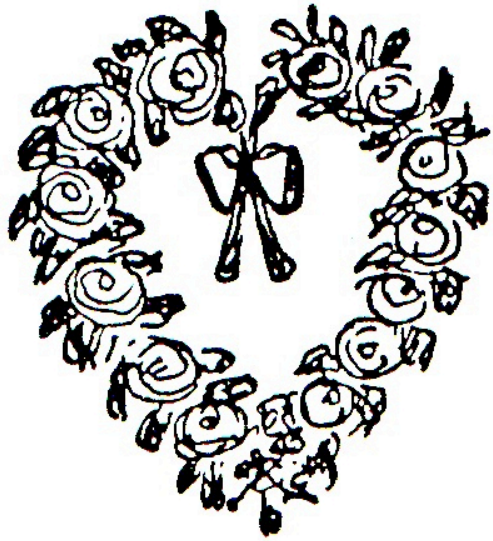

Welcome to our Rose Show “For the Love of Roses”

The South Coast Rose Society (SCRS) is pleased to welcome you to its 27th annual rose show, Saturday and Sunday, May 6 and 7, 2006. The show will be conducted in accordance with the guidelines of the American Rose Society (ARS) with accredited judges evaluating each class.

The show offers exhibition classes to showcase the roses of all exhibitors, whatever their experience. All exhibitors and lovers of roses are welcomed and encouraged to attend and exhibit. **Please read all of the Rules carefully.**

Entries in all classes will be received from 6:00 AM until 9:45 AM (firm) on the day of the show. Please consider how long it will take to prepare your entries and allow enough time. Experienced exhibitors are requested to please assist the novices in preparing their entries when possible, as we all need help in the beginning.

All classes are open to all exhibitors except Classes 29, 30, 31, open only to exhibitors who have never won an ARS certificate at an ARS Rose Show; Class 36 (Judges only); and Classes 37 and 38, open to SCRS members only.

The Best Horticultural Entry in the show will be chosen from the trophy winners at the close of judging. Trophies will be awarded to all classes (except Class 38); ARS Certificates will be awarded to all qualified classes. Awards will be presented at 2:00 PM Saturday. All winners should be present to accept their trophies or certificates or make arrangements to have them accepted by another person.

- CLASS 1 BOB BUTLER MEMORIAL**
Representative of the rose varieties he loved to grow.
Six floribunda sprays: two each of three varieties,
each variety in a separate vase (3 vases per entry).
- CLASS 2 JOE AND AGNES WINCHEL MEMORIAL**
One bloom of any rose hybridized by Joe Winchel

Section B
HYBRID TEAS & GRANDIFLORAS

- CLASS 3 ONE BLOOM** - without sidebuds
Queen ARS Certificate
King ARS Certificate
Princess of Show ARS Certificate
Court of Honor of six additional blooms of merit
- CLASS 4 THREE BLOOMS** - without sidebuds
One variety in a single vase.
- CLASS 5 ONE SPRAY** ARS Certificate
- CLASS 6 THREE SPRAYS**
One or any combination of varieties in a single vase.
List varieties.
- CLASS 7 ONE FULLY OPEN BLOOM** ARS Certificate
- CLASS 8 CYCLE OF BLOOM** - without sidebuds
One variety in a single vase.
- CLASS 9 ROSE IN A BOWL** ARS Certificate
One bloom floating in water. No foliage.
- CLASS 10 ENGLISH BOX** ARS Certificate
One or more varieties. No foliage. List varieties.

Section C
FLORIBUNDAS & POLYANTHAS

- CLASS 11 ONE FLORIBUNDA BLOOM** ARS Certificate
Bloom should be without sidebuds.
- CLASS 12 ONE FLORIBUNDA SPRAY** ARS Certificate
- CLASS 13 THREE FLORIBUNDA SPRAYS**
One or more varieties in a single vase. List varieties.
- CLASS 14 ONE POLYANTHA SPRAY** ARS Certificate

Section D
MINIATURES & MINI-FLORAS

- CLASS 15 ONE BLOOM** - without sidebuds
Queen ARS Certificate
King ARS Certificate
Princess of Show ARS Certificate
Court of Honor of six additional blooms of merit
- CLASS 16 THREE BLOOMS** - without sidebuds
One variety in a single vase.
- CLASS 17 ONE SPRAY** ARS Certificate
- CLASS 18 THREE SPRAYS**
One or more varieties in a single vase. List varieties.
- CLASS 19 ONE BLOOM OF 4-8 PETALS** ARS Certificate
Without sidebuds
- CLASS 20 CYCLE OF BLOOM** One variety in a single vase.
- CLASS 21 ROSE IN A BOWL** ARS Certificate
One bloom floating in water. No foliage.
- CLASS 22 ENGLISH BOX** ARS Certificate
One or more varieties. List varieties. No foliage

Section E
OLD GARDEN ROSES

The date of introduction and type (example: Bourbon)
must be written on the entry tag.

- CLASS 23 DOWAGER QUEEN** ARS Certificate
One bloom or spray. Varieties introduced prior to 1867, including roses of unknown dates known to have been in existence prior to 1867.
- CLASS 24 VICTORIAN AWARD** ARS Certificate
One bloom or spray. Varieties introduced in 1867 or after, or with unknown dates of introduction after 1867.
- CLASS 25 GENESIS AWARD** ARS Certificate
One bloom or spray. Varieties designated as Species (Sp) in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses or any ARS approved publication.

Section F
CLIMBERS & SHRUBS

- CLASS 26 ONE CLIMBER BLOOM OR SPRAY** ARS Certificate
Includes Large Flowered Climber, Climbing Hybrid Tea with no bush counterpart, and Hybrid Wichurana
- CLASS 27 ONE CLASSIC SHRUB BLOOM OR SPRAY**
ARS Certificate
Roses of the following classes: hybrid musks, hybrid rugosas, hybrid moyesii, and hybrid kordesii
- CLASS 28 ONE MODERN SHRUB BLOOM OR SPRAY**
ARS Certificate
Varieties listed as shrub (S) in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses, including David Austin roses.

Section G
NOVICE

ARS Certificate for best entry in Class 29, 30 or 31
Open **only** to exhibitors who have never won an ARS certificate at an ARS Rose Show. Single blooms should not have sidebuds.

- CLASS 29 ONE HYBRID TEA, GRANDIFLORA, FLORIBUNDA or POLYANTHA BLOOM or SPRAY**
- CLASS 30 ONE OLD GARDEN ROSE or CLASSIC SHRUB or MODERN SHRUB BLOOM or SPRAY**
includes David Austin roses
- CLASS 31 ONE MINIATURE OR MINI-FLORA BLOOM or SPRAY**

Section H
MISCELLANEOUS

- CLASS 32 MOST FRAGRANT MODERN ROSE**
ARS Certificate
One bloom of HT, Grandiflora or Floribunda.
(judged: 60% form,40% fragrance)
- CLASS 33 MOST FRAGRANT OLD GARDEN ROSE or SHRUB**
ARS Certificate
One bloom of Old Garden Rose (OGR) or Classic or Modern Shrub (S) (judged: 60% form,40% fragrance)
- CLASS 34 SEEDLING ROSE** ARS Certificate
Any variety hybridized or found by the exhibitor not yet introduced into commerce.
- CLASS 35 SPRING-THEMED ARRANGEMENT**
Mixed flowers featuring roses. For fun. No rules.
May provide your own container. (If so, please place your name on the bottom of your container. Please also see Rule #6.)

Rules for Exhibitors

CLASS 36 JUDGES' ENTRY

One ARS Certificate for best overall entry in Class 36. Trophy awarded for each category. Multiple entries by participating judges are encouraged.

ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY:

- (a) HYBRID TEA and GRANDIFLORA
- (b) FLORIBUNDA and POLYANTHA
- (c) MINIATURE and MINI-FLORA
- (d) OLD GARDEN ROSES
- (e) SHRUBS (CLASSIC OR MODERN) and CLIMBERS

Section I

Open to South Coast Rose Society Members Only

CLASS 37 ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY:

Multiple entries are encouraged, subject to Show Rules.

- (a) HYBRID TEA and GRANDIFLORA
- (b) FLORIBUNDA
- (c) MINIATURE and MINI-FLORA
- (d) OLD GARDEN ROSES
- (e) SHRUBS (CLASSIC OR MODERN) and CLIMBERS

CLASS 38 HELP ME IDENTIFY THIS ROSE

Bring your roses and we might help you identify them.

No entry tag needed.

All classes are open to all exhibitors except Section G, Classes 29, 30, 31; Class 36 (Judges only); and Classes 37 and 38, which are only open to South Coast Rose Society members.

Trophies will be presented at 2:00 PM Saturday. Exhibitors and judges should be present to accept their trophies or make arrangements to have them accepted by another person.

1. The show will be governed by the standard rules, regulations, and guidelines of the American Rose Society. Decisions of the judges are final.
2. Competition is open to all. All roses must have been grown by the exhibitor in his or her own private outdoor garden.
3. Only one person or team from any one garden may enter a rose class.
4. Entries in all classes will be received from 6:00 AM until 9:45 AM (firm) on Saturday, May 6.
5. All exhibitors must register. There is no charge to enter.
6. Containers will be furnished by SCRS, except exhibitors may furnish a container for Class 35. There will be no trading of containers. All personal containers will become the property of SCRS and will not be returned (except those for Class 35 – if you cannot return for your container, please leave addressed shipping box with adequate postage).
7. Only ARS entry tags (supplied) may be used. Complete the upper portion of the tag using blue or black ball point pen, stamps or name labels (entry number not required). Fold tag securely before placement.
8. Wedges or supports may be used, with the exception of plastic wrap. Supports protruding above the lip of the container will be penalized according to the degree of distraction.
9. All roses in each class will be placed alphabetically; each variety within the class will constitute a separate group to be judged separately.
10. An exhibitor MAY NOT enter two of the same variety in any one class. Duplicate entries will disqualify both. Exhibitors may enter two (or more) DIFFERENT varieties in the same class.
11. Every rose must be entered under its recognized ARS exhibition name, as set forth in bold type in the *ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses*, or the ARS book *The Official List of Approved Exhibition Names*, or in *Modern Roses XI* or *The Combined Rose List*. When differences occur, ARS publications take precedence.
12. Entries in violation of the Show Rules must be disqualified. Entries must also be disqualified for the following reasons: a) Misnamed, misclassified, misplaced, unlabeled or mislabeled; b) Stem-on-stem (except for OGRs and Shrubs); c) Presence of foreign substance applied to the foliage, stem, or bloom to enhance appearance; d) Not disbudded when required.
13. All entries must be placed by the Show Placement committee. The only exceptions are classes 1, 2, 9, 21, and 35 which may be placed by the exhibitor.
14. All specimens entered become the property of the SCRS. The show committee reserves the right to remove wilted blooms.
15. Neither the South Coast Botanic Gardens nor the South Coast Rose Society assume any responsibility for loss or damage to the personal property of exhibitors.
16. Only blue ribbon winners will be eligible for trophies.
17. Trophies will be awarded at 2:00 PM on Saturday, May 6. ARS Certificates will be awarded in all qualified classes. All winners should be present to accept their trophies or certificates or should make arrangements for their delivery.
