ENTRY RULES

1. This show adheres to the rules laid down by the AMERICAN ROSE SOCIETY for organizing a Rose Show as specified in the American Rose Society "Guide lines for Judging Roses".
2. **This rose show is open to all rose gardeners.** *All roses* entered in this show must have been grown in the exhibitor's outdoor garden. The exhibitor need not be a member of a Rose Society. (Members of recognized youth groups may have a garden away from their home.)
3. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST REGISTER at the registration desk. **Entries will be received May 2, 2009 from 6:00 am to 9:30 am.** Judging will begin at about 10:00am
4. **NOVICE** is defined as those persons who have **never won a trophy in an American Rose Society sanctioned Rose Show.**

5. Vases will be furnished by the show sponsors.
6. Only ARS entry tags are acceptable, securely folded before entries are placed. *Only the upper portion of the entry tag must be completed. **Blue or black ball point pen only***
7. Only ONE exhibitor (or one team) from any one garden may enter any class for which they are qualified. More than one entry of the same variety from the same garden in any one class will disqualify both entries. **All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor only.**
8. The responsibility for proper identification and classification lies totally with the exhibitor, HOWEVER, ALL POSSIBLE ASSISTANCE WILL BE AVAILABLE by means of current recognized publications and our own Consulting Rosarians.
9. *All entries must be entered under the ARS official exhibition names;* however, exhibitors may also include a rose's commercial name on the entry tag.
10. This is an alphabetically arranged show. Each variety will constitute a separate group within the class and will be judged on its merits for the variety. Combinations of varieties will be judged as one group.
11. All multiple stem entries are to be one variety unless stated otherwise.
12. Wedging or supports may be used. Clear plastic wrap, aluminum foil or other non-distracting material may be used. Wedging protruding above the lip of the vase is subject to penalization.
13. AVOID DISQUALIFICATION – Be careful of the following: A rose entry is disqualified if it is:
 - *Misnamed;
 - *Misclassified;
 - *Misplaced;
 - *Unlabeled or Mislabeled (including omission of the exhibitors name or its location anywhere but where specified);
 - *Stem-on-stem, except Old Garden Roses and Shrubs;
 - *Foreign substance on foliage, stem, or bloom;
 - *Not disbudded in classes requiring one bloom per stem;
 - *Violation of show rules, an entry in Violation of ARS or local show rules;
 - ***Improperly named roses:** Roses must be listed in the most current editions of the American Rose Society publications with ARS exhibition names to be eligible for entry in ARS authorized rose shows, i.e. Modern Roses, International Rose Registrations Supplements to date, Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges & Exhibitors, Handbook for Selecting Roses, American Rose magazine and the Combined Rose List. (*In case of conflict between The Combined Rose List and ARS Publications, ARS publications will be the final authority.*)**In case of disqualification or severe penalization, the judges will write the reason on the entry tag.**
14. Neither the KERN COUNTY ROSE SOCIETY, Inc., nor the COUNTY OF KERN assumes any responsibility for loss of, or damage to, personal property; however, care will be exercised to protect exhibits on display.
15. Trophies will be awarded to the best in each class or section **Saturday, May 2 2009 at 2:00 pm**. All winners should be present to accept their awards. Rosettes will remain with the show until closing; those not picked up 30 minutes after closing will be mailed to the exhibitor.

16. Trophies will be awarded to Queen, King, Princess, Mini Queen, Mini King, and Mini Princess, Dowager Queen and Victorian Award. Best in each Class will receive a trophy. The court of honor will receive Rosettes. The best entry of a novice who is a member of the Kern County Rose Society, Inc. will receive the Walter Stiern perpetual trophy. All classes where an American Rose Society Certificate is appropriate will receive the certificate. Trophies will be awarded only to first place winners. **Judges decisions are final.**
17. **After judging begins no individual not involved in the judging process will be allowed in the exhibition area.**
18. **The judges entry is open to ARS judges & family members judging this show.** Horticultural judges who are judging the horticultural division may also enter the arrangement division.

SECTION A CHALLENGE CLASS

In Classes 1 through 6, exhibitors shall place their own entry. Each entry will be allotted space appropriate to the size of the entry.

Class 1

HYBRID TEA CYCLE OF BLOOM, THREE STEMS of the same variety showing three stages of development; one bud, sepals down and petals beginning to unfurl, one approximately one-half open or in its most perfect phase of beauty, and one fully open bloom, stamens showing, displayed in separate containers.

Award: Trophy for best in class and KCRS certificate.

Class 2

OLD GARDEN ROSES, as designated in ARS publications, FIVE STEMS, each a different variety, shown in separate containers. **Date and Type** must be listed on the entry tag in the upper right-hand corner. (Including roses of unknown date known to have been in existence before or after 1867.)

Award: Trophy for best in class and KCRS certificate.

Class 3

FLORIBUNDA SPRAYS, FIVE SPRAYS, each a different variety, displayed in separate containers.

Award: Trophy for best in class and KCRS certificate.

Class 4

MODERN SHRUB ROSES, as designated in ARS publications, FIVE STEMS, shown one bloom per stem or spray, **introduced after 1960**. Shown in separate containers, each a different variety.

Award: Trophy for best in class and KCRS certificate.

Class 5

LOOK ALIKES--- ONE exhibition stage HT, G. or FL and ONE Miniature/ Mini-Flora that look alike in color and form: displayed in separate containers .

One entry per garden.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS certificate.

SECTION B

Hybrid Teas and Grandiflora

Class 6

ONE *Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora* BLOOM, displaying exhibition form, without side buds.

Awards: **Trophy** *Queen of Show – ARS Gold Certificate*
Trophy *King of Show – ARS Silver Certificate*
Trophy *Princess of Show – ARS Bronze Certificate*
Rosettes *Court of Honor – the next three blue ribbon winners*

Class 7

THREE *Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora* BLOOMS – ONE BLOOM PER STEM displaying exhibition form, without sidebuds. One variety or a combination of varieties shown in one container.

Award: *Trophy for best in class*

Class 8

SIX *Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora* BLOOMS – ONE BLOOM PER STEM displaying exhibition form, without sidebuds. One variety or a combination of varieties shown in one container.

Award: *Trophy for best in class.*

Class 9

ONE *Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora* BLOOM FULLY OPENED without sidebuds. Stamens must be showing. No single varieties

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.*

Class 10

ENGLISH BOX, SIX (6) *Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora* BLOOMS displaying exhibition form, without foliage. One variety or a combination of varieties.

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.*

Class 11

ONE DECORATIVE *Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora* BLOOM, including SINGLE varieties (4 > 8 petals) or any other varieties which do not compete in **Class “7”**

Award: *Trophy for best in class.*

Class 12

ONE *Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora* SPRAY. Must have two (2) or more blooms and may have sidebuds.

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate*

Class 13

ONE *Classic Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora* BLOOM without side buds.

Introduced 1867 through 1960, Date of introduction **MUST** appear on the entry tags in the upper right corner. **JUDGING WILL BE BASED UPON THE MERIT OF THE ENTRY** for that variety, and the typical exhibition form will not necessarily be required.

Award: *Trophy for best in class.*

ONE *Floribunda* SPRAY

Awards: **Trophy** *FL Spray Queen of Show – ARS Gold Certificate*

Class 15

THREE *Floribunda* SPRAYS One variety or a combination of varieties.
Shown in one container
Award: Trophy for best in class.

Class 16

ONE *Floribunda* BLOOM OF A SINGLE VARIETY, without side buds.(4>8 petals)
Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

Class 17

ONE *Floribunda* BLOOM without side buds. No single varieties
Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

Class 18

THREE *Floribunda* BLOOMS without side buds. Shown in one container.
Award: Trophy for best in class

SECTION D
Polyanthas

Class 19

ONE *Polyantha* SPRAY
Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

Class 20

THREE *Polyantha* SPRAYS One variety or a combination of varieties. Shown in one container.
Award: Trophy for best in class.

SECTION E
Climbers & Hybrid Wichuranas

Class 21

ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY *Climber & Hybrid Wichuranas* not having a bush counterpart.
Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

Class 22

ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY OF A SINGLE VARIETY *Climber & Hybrid Wichuranas* not having a bush counterpart, (4 to 8 petals).
Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

SECTION F *Old Garden Roses*

NOTE: All Roses entered in Section "F" MUST have the Date of introduction and type entered at the top right hand corner of the entry tag.

Class 23

Dowager Queen ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY, any type *Old Garden Rose* introduced before 1867 also those of unknown date but known to have existed before 1867.
Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Dowager Queen Certificate.

Class 24

THREE STEMS any type *Old Garden Rose* ONE BLOOM PER STEM OR SPRAYS. One variety or a combination of varieties shown in one container. Introduced before 1867 also those of unknown date but known to have existed before 1867.
Award: Trophy for best in class

Class 25

Victorian Award ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY, any type *Old Garden Rose*

introduced 1867 or later also those of unknown date but known to have existed in 1867 or later.

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Victorian Award.*

Class 26

THREE STEMS, any type *Old Garden Rose*, ONE BLOOM PER STEM OR SPRAYS. One variety or a combination of varieties shown in one container. Introduced 1867 or later also those of unknown date but known to have existed in 1867 or later.

Award: *Trophy for best in class.*

Class 27

Genesis Award ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY, *Species Rose*.

Roses designated as Species (Sp) in ARS Publications.

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Genesis Certificate.*

Class 28

ENGLISH BOX, SIX (6) *Old Garden Rose* BLOOMS displayed, without foliage. One variety or a combination of varieties.

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.*

SECTION G

Seedling

Class 29

ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY *Seedling*– ANY TYPE, Must have been grown by the exhibitor from seed.

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.*

SECTION H

Shrubs

Classic Shrubs are those shrubs which have family designations, i.e.--
-- Hybrid moyesii, hybrid musk, hybrid rugosa, kordessii, etc. as identified in ARS publications. Family designation must be placed at the top right hand corner of the entry tag

ONE BLOOM, ***Classic Shrub***

Award: *Trophy for best in class.*

Class 31

ONE SPRAY, ***Classic Shrub***

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.*

Modern shrubs are those which are, identified as (S) in ARS publications, which include those roses AKA “David Austin Roses”, etc..

Class 32

ONE BLOOM, ***Modern shrub***

Award: *Trophy for best in class.*

Class 33

ONE SPRAY, ***Modern shrub***

Award: *Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate..*

Class 34

THREE STEMS *Shrub roses* ONE BLOOM PER STEM OR SPRAY. One variety or a combination of varieties shown in one container. Open to Modern and Classic shrubs.

Award: Trophy for best in class.

Class 35

ENGLISH BOX, SIX (6) *Shrub* BLOOMS displayed, without foliage. One variety or a combination of varieties.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

SECTION I

Miniature Roses & or Mini-Flora™ Roses

Class 36

ONE *Miniature Rose* BLOOM displaying exhibition form. One bloom per stem without side buds. *No Mini-Floras™*

Awards: Trophy Mini-Queen of Show – ARS Gold Certificate

Trophy Mini-King of Show – ARS Silver Certificate

Trophy Mini-Princess of Show – ARS Bronze Certificate

Rosettes Court of Honor – the next three blue ribbon winners

ONE *Mini-Flora™ Rose* BLOOM displaying exhibition form. One bloom per stem without side buds.

SIX *Miniature Rose or Mini-Flora™* BLOOMS, ONE BLOOM PER STEM, displaying exhibition form, without side buds

One variety or a combination of varieties in one container..

Award: Trophy for best in class

Class 40

ONE *Miniature Rose or Mini-Flora™* BLOOM, FULLY OPENED without side buds No single varieties. Stamens must be showing.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

Class 41

ONE *Miniature Rose or Mini-Flora*TM SPRAY. No single varieties. Must have two (2) or more blooms, and may have sidebuds.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

Class 42

THREE *Miniature Roses or Mini-Flora*TM SPRAYS No single varieties, shown in one container.

Award: Trophy for best in class

Class 43

ENGLISH BOX - SIX (6) *Miniature Roses or Mini-Flora*TM, displaying exhibition form without foliage. One variety or a combination of varieties.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

Class 44

ONE SINGLE VARIETY *Miniature Rose or Mini-Flora*TM BLOOM without side buds, four to eight petals.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate

Class 45

ONE SINGLE VARIETY *Miniature Rose or Mini-Flora*TM SPRAY, four to eight _____ petals.

Award: Trophy for best in class.

Class 46

ONE BLOOM or SPRAY *Decorative Miniature Rose or Mini-Flora*TM.

Award: Trophy for best in class

SECTION J

Judges Entry

Class 47

ONE BLOOM PER STEM without sidebuds,

a - Hybrid Tea & Grandiflora **b - Miniature or Mini-Flora**TM All other

classes may be ONE BLOOM PER STEM or SPRAY. OGR's must have Date and Classification in the upper right hand corner. Sub-class designation must be noted on the entry tag.

c - Floribunda & Polyantha

d - Old Garden Rose

e - Shrub

f - Climbers & Hybrid Wichuranas

Judges must be judging this show. No restrictions on the number of entries.

Award: Trophy for best in section. ARS Certificate for each sub-class

SECTION K

Childs Entry

Open to children under 16 years exhibiting roses grown in their home garden.

ONE BLOOM PER STEM OR SPRAY Multiple entries may be made as long as they are a different variety. Sub-class designation must be noted on the entry tag.

Class 48

ONE BLOOM without side buds or, ONE SPRAY

a - Hybrid Tea & Grandiflora

b - Floribunda & Polyantha

SECTION N ECLECTIC CLASSES

Class 51

ONE SPRAY *Miniature, Mini-Flora™ or Polyantha*

One spray, blooms not to exceed one (1) inch in diameter, exhibited in an orchid tube on black velvet cloth lying on the table. Entry must be placed by the exhibitor.

[Tube & cloth supplied by the show committee]

Judging Criteria: *50% for horticultural excellence and 50% on overall display.*

Award: Trophy for best in section..

Class 52

FLOATING . *Miniature Rose or Mini-Flora™* BLOOM bloom exhibition stage displayed without foliage floating in a small bowl, provided. No more than one per garden. Bloom may not touch the bottom of the bowl.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate

Class 53

FLOATING . *Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, Floribunda or Shrub*

With out foliage in a large bowl provided. Bloom must be floating. One entry per exhibiter.

Award: Trophy for best in section , ARS Certificate .

Class 54

MOST FRAGRANT *Hybrid Tea , Grandiflora or Floribunda* BLOOM - One bloom without sidebuds.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

Class 55

MOST FRAGRANT *OGR or Shrub* BLOOM - Open to OGR, Modern and Classic shrubs.

Award: Trophy for best in class and ARS Certificate.

SECTION O UNKNOWN ROSES

Class 56

ONE BLOOM without side buds, or SPRAY of a rose that is unknown or unregistered

Award: No Trophy

Judges, exhibitors and public are invited to identify these roses if they recognize the rose.

ARTISTIC DESIGN DIVISION RULES FOR ARRANGEMENT EXHIBITORS

1. The Rose Show will be governed and judged by the rules, regulations and guidelines of the American Rose Society, as set forth in the Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements.
2. The Arrangement Division is open to any amateur exhibitor. Exhibitors need not be a member of the Kern County Rose Society however, the Gena Uhalt Perpetual Award is only open to a member of the KCRS.
3. The show will be held at the Norris Road Veterans Hall, Bakersfield, CA, Saturday, May 2, 2009. The arrangement exhibition area will open Saturday, May 2 at 7 am. Entries will be accepted until 9:30 am. Judging will begin at 10 am. **No late entries will be allowed.** The show will be open for viewing at the completion of judging. Arrangers will be advised at entry time when they may pick up their arrangements, containers and other properties. **No entries may be removed before the time specified.**

NOTE: Those arrangers who will not be in attendance at show take down should make arrangements to have someone pick up their arrangement, containers and other properties who will take responsibility for their return.

4. Staging: **STANDARD ARRANGEMENTS.** For all standard arrangements, 30' wide tables will be placed against walls that are covered with a neutral beige cloth, which provides the background for the staging area. The table tops will be covered with a white tablecloth. Each individual arrangement will be allotted 30" in width; therefore, each standard arrangement entry will have a table top surface area of 30" x 30"
MINIATURE ARRANGEMENTS. For all miniature arrangements 30" wide tables will be placed against walls with a stepped riser placed on the table. The stepped staging will be covered with white tablecloths which provides the background for the staging area. The table tops will be covered with tablecloths.. Arrangements will be allotted 12" in width.
5. All roses must be **outdoor garden grown** and must be of high quality
6. Names of all roses in each arrangement must be written on the entry tag. All roses must be correctly named in accordance with the latest edition of Modern Roses, Handbook for Selecting Roses, Combined Rose List or the *New Rose Registrations in the AMERICAN ROSE*. All roses must be exhibited under their ARS Exhibition Names. A rose variety need not be registered with the ARS to be exhibited in this show, but must be listed in the ARS recognized publication. ARS publication take priority over Combined Rose List.
7. A rose or roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements.
8. American Rose Society Medal Certificates may be awarded to arrangements using arranger grown, fresh roses. Entry tags shall be marked "**AG**" if they were grown by the exhibitor. The Judges Section are not eligible for the Medal Certificates.
9. One entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class but, the exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired.
10. Accessories are not allowed unless stated otherwise in this schedule. Flowers other than roses and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule. Natural wood (dried, weathered, treated, etc.) is considered **dried** plant material unless it has been made into an art object, i.e. a statue. It is then considered an accessory.
11. A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the arranger's interpretation of the theme or class title.

12. The exhibitors are responsible for placing their own arrangements. An arrangement incorrectly placed in one class when it should have been placed in another will be judged in the class in which it has been placed.
13. Each exhibit must be the work of a single exhibitor.
14. No one but the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement.
15. Plant material other than roses may be commercially grown. **All roses must be fresh**, except for those classes which specify dried roses.
16. In classes for miniature arrangements, the design must conform to the size specified on each class and **ONLY** those roses classified by the ARS as *miniature or mini-flora*TM may be used.
17. Backgrounds, niches and underlays may be used, if desired, but must be provided by the exhibitor. There are no height restrictions for standard arrangements but, all parts of the arrangement must be confined within the allotted surface space. In miniature arrangements, backgrounds, niches and underlays are a component of the design and must conform to any size limitation.
18. Purple ribbon winners must score 90 or higher. To be eligible for American Rose Society Awards, arrangements must score no less than 92 points. Only purple ribbon winners are eligible for American Rose Society Awards.
19. Arranger's names should be on the bottom of containers, etc. Neither the Kern County Rose nor the COUNTY OF KERN assumes responsibility for the loss of, or damage to personal property; however, care will be exercised to protect exhibits.
20. By entering this show given under ARS rules, exhibitors agree to abide by those rules.
21. Arrangement Judges who are judging this show may only enter in the Judges Section "G".
22. All winners are requested to be present at 2:00 pm Saturday, May 2 to accept their trophies or make specific arrangements for their acceptance and delivery
23. In addition to the appropriate ARS awards, a permanent trophy will be awarded to the best entry in each **section**.

Infringement of the following rules will result in severe penalty

1. Painted or dyed fresh plant materials, and live creatures are not allowed.
2. The use of plant materials on the state or local conservation lists is not permitted.
3. The American flag or flag of any country may not be used in an arrangement or as a decoration in any way.

There are but two causes for disqualification of an arrangement:

1. Roses are not outdoor grown.
2. Use of artificial plant material.

Class 1: “Champagne Cocktail”

Traditional line or line-mass arrangement using all fresh plant materials

Class 2: “Lemon Meringue”

Traditional mass arrangement using all fresh plant materials.

Section B – Modern

Award: Trophy for Best in Section and ARS Artist Rosette

Class 3: “Honey Dijon”

A freeform design.

Class 4: “Cherries “n” Cream”

A transparency design. Accessories may be used.

Section C – Oriental

Award: Trophy for Best in Section and ARS Oriental Rosette

Class 5: “*Wild Ginger*”

Arrangement in the oriental manner using all fresh plant material in a low container. Water must be visible to allow reflection.

Class 6: “*Orange Beauty*”

Arrangement in the oriental manner using all fresh plant material in a tall container.

Section D – Mini-Royalty

Award: Trophy for Best in Section and ARS Mini-Royalty

Class 7: “*Wedding Cake*”

Miniature line or line-mass arrangement not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth.

Class 8: “*Green Ice*”

Miniature mass arrangement not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth.

Section E – Mini-Artist

Award: Trophy for Best in Section and ARS Mini-Artist

Class 9: “*Cinnamon Twist*”

Miniature modern design arrangement, arranger’s choice, not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth.

Class 10: “*Apricot Candy*”

Miniature modern design arrangement in the free-form or transparency style not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth.

Section F – Mini-Oriental

Award: Trophy for Best in Section and ARS Mini-Oriental

Class 11: “*Peach Blossom*”

Miniature arrangement in the oriental manner using a low container, design not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth. Water must be visible to allow reflection.

Class 12: “Raspberry Ice”

Miniature arrangement in the oriental free style, design not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth. Accessories may be used.

Section G – Judges

Award: Best in class ARS Judges Certificate

Judges must be judging this show.

Class 13: “Tangerine Jewel”

Modern or abstract arrangement, but type must be stated on entry tag. All fresh plant material

Class 14: “Typhoo Tea”

Arrangement in the oriental manner, designer’s choice , but type must be stated on entry tag.

Class 15: “Goarmet Popcorn”

Miniature arrangement, designer’s choice, but type must be stated on entry tag.

Section H – Novice

Entries are open to those who have won **one** blue ribbon or less.

Award: Trophy for Best in Section.

Class 16: “Wild Berry Breeze”

Traditional mass, line-mass or line arrangement using all fresh plant materials

Class 17: “Hot Tamale”

Miniature arrangement not exceeding 10 inches in height, width or depth. No design or materials restriction

Award: Trophy for Best in Class and

ARS Junior Arrangement Award for best in section.

Age 10 and under

Class 18: “Hot Cocoa”

Arranger choice of design. Accessories may be used.

Class 19: "Watermelon Ice"

Miniature roses in arranger's choice of design under 10 inches in height, width or depth.

Section J -- Junior Designs

*Award: Trophy for Best in Class and
ARS Junior Arrangement Award for best in section.*

Ages 11-17 years old

Class 20: "Peppermint Twist"

Arranger choice of design, but type must be stated on entry tag.
Using all fresh plant material

Class 21: "Fortane Cookie"

Miniature roses in arranger choice of design under 10 inches in height, width or depth.
