RULES FOR HORTICULTURAL EXHIBITS:

1. Properties will be available beginning at 5:30 and entries will close promptly at 9:45 am. Judging will start at 10:00 am.
2. This show adheres to the rules of The American Rose Society in organizing a rose show. Anyone may exhibit roses in this show. All roses have been grown in the exhibitor's outdoor garden.
3. All exhibitors must register their name and address at the Registration Table.
4. Only ARS entry tags may be used, with only the upper portion of the entry tag filled out with name and full address. Use only black or blue ballpoint pens. No felt pens. The entry tag should be folded and closed.
5. Only one exhibitor or one team from any one garden may enter any class.
6. The responsibility for proper identification and classification lies with the exhibitor.
7. This is an alphabetically arranged show, except for Section A. Each variety will constitute a separate group within the class, and will be judged on its merit for that variety. More than one entry of the same variety by an exhibitor in a class will disqualify all.
8. The placement committee will place the roses except for the challenge classes. Exhibitors may **optionally** place roses in classes with multiple roses in one container and classes with multiple containers: 3, 7, 8, 11, 13, 15, 21, 25, 26, 29, 34, and 40.
9. During judging, only individuals with specifically assigned jobs will be allowed in the show area.
- 10.** Wedging or support materials are permitted. Judges may penalize for wedging protruding above the vase.

11. **AVOID DISQUALIFICATION.** ARS rules for rose disqualifications are as follows: misnamed, misclassified, mislabeled, misplaced, stem on stem (except Old Garden Roses and Shrubs), presence of a foreign substance, side buds, violation of ARS or local show rules, and roses without an approved exhibition name. If an entry is disqualified, the judges will write the reason on the entry tag.
12. Roses must be exhibited with an ARS approved exhibition name (AEN). Names may be verified in the following officially recognized sources: 1. Modern Roses 2. Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Exhibitors and Judges 3. Handbook for Selecting Roses 4. American Rose Magazine Rose Registrations page 5. ARS Website - Recent Rose Registrations 6. Combined Rose List (CRL). The most recent ARS publication will take precedence. In cases where a variety is not listed in any of the ARS official publications, the CRL may be used as a reference. In the event there is a conflict between the CRL and an ARS publication, the ARS publication will prevail.
13. Judging will be in accordance with current Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses. The Judges decisions are final.
14. Judges and immediate family members may not enter roses except in classes 31 & 44.
15. The Orange County Rose Society and Roger's Gardens will not accept responsibility for loss or damage to personal property.
16. Trophies will be awarded on Saturday, October 24th, 2009 at 2:30 pm. All winners should be present or make arrangements for their Trophy acceptance with the show chairperson, Jan Brider, 714.779.8032.

CHALLENGE CLASS

CLASS 1 VIRGINIA CARLSON CHALLENGE CLASS

Only open to members of the Orange County Rose Society, Five Roses, each in its own container, staged by the exhibitor, One Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora bloom, One Floribunda bloom or spray, One Miniature bloom or spray, One Shrub Rose bloom or spray, and One Old Garden Rose bloom or spray. Trophy

CLASS 2 CAL AND BARB HAYES CHALLENGE CLASS

Nine Miniature Roses, each a different variety and of exhibition quality shown at exhibition stage, correctly named, without sidebuds and displayed in separate containers. Trophy

CLASS 3 BILL AND CONNIE WILKIE CHALLENGE CLASS

Only open to members of the Orange County Rose Society Three Floribunda sprays, each of a different variety displayed in a single container. Trophy

CLASS 4 ROSE IN A PICTURE FRAME

One bloom any type or form may be shown with or without foliage. Limit one per exhibitor. Frames furnished by OCRS. Trophy

CLASS 6 ONE DECORATIVE HYBRID TEA BLOOM without sidebuds that cannot present hybrid tea exhibition form. Entries that can present hybrid tea form will not be considered and will be disqualified. Trophy

CLASS 7 THREE BLOOMS without sidebuds
One variety, in one container. Trophy

CLASS 8 CYCLE OF BLOOM Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimens of one variety showing the three stages of bloom. One bud with sepals down just beginning to unfurl, one bloom at exhibition stage, and one fully open bloom with stamens showing; exhibited in separate containers. Trophy

CLASS 9 ONE BLOOM FULLY OPEN Without sidebuds, stamens must be showing ARS Certificate & Trophy

CLASS 10 ONE SPRAY must have two or more blooms ARS Certificate & Trophy

CLASS 11 ENGLISH BOX One or more varieties, list varieties on back of card ARS Certificate & Trophy

Section C FLORIBUNDAS and POLYANTHAS

CLASS 12 ONE BLOOM without sidebuds, no singles ARS Certificate & Trophy

CLASS 13 THREE BLOOMS without sidebuds, one variety in one container Trophy

CLASS 14 ONE SPRAY must have two or more blooms ARS Certificate & Trophy

CLASS 15 THREE SPRAYS One variety in one container Trophy

CLASS 16 ONE SINGLE VARIETY BLOOM 4-8 Petals without sidebuds Trophy

CLASS 17 ONE SINGLE VARIETY SPRAY must have two or more blooms with 4-8 Petals Trophy

CLASS 18 ONE POLYANTHA SPRAY must have two or more blooms ARS Certificate & Trophy

Section D SHRUBS

CLASS 19 CLASSIC SHRUB One bloom or spray, roses designated by a family classified as a shrub, i.e., Hrg, HMsk

CLASS 36 ONE BLOOM OR SPRAY One bloom or spray. Large Flowered Climbers (LCL), Hybrid Wichuranas (HWiich), and Hybrid Giganteas (HG)

CLASS 37 ONE SEEDLING, ANY TYPE (NO SPORTS) One stem, any variety hybridized by the exhibitor, if known, show parentage on entry tag ARS Certificate & Trophy

CLASS 38 JUNIOR ENTRY

For youth under 18 years old, any type of rose, must be prepared by the entrant

- A** Any type of bloom, except miniatures, no stem or foliage, the flower must float freely in the bowl

CLASS 40 ARTIST PALETTE Five Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora roses, sepals may show. They must all be of different varieties and should be arranged from dark to light, and from left to right on the palette Trophy

RULES FOR ARRANGEMENTS

1. To be eligible for the Medal Certificates, the roses must be arranger grown and so designated by placing an "AG" in the upper right corner of the entry tag. All arranger grown entries are eligible for the ARS Medal Certificates except class 45. Since Class 45 is restricted to OSRS, it doesn't qualify for Medal Certificates.
2. Roses must be the dominant feature of all arrangements. Only first place winners are eligible for the Trophy and must score 92 points or more to be eligible for Rosette and Medal Certificates.
3. All roses must be correctly named and listed on the entry tag along with the Exhibitor number.
4. All arrangements must be set up and placed by the arranger. The arrangements are going to be staged on tables covered with dark green table linens and Miniature arrangements will be elevated to eye level on risers.
5. All miniature arrangements must use roses classified by ARS as miniature or mini-flora.
6. Niches, backdrops, bases and accessories are optional. The arranger has the choice of container(s), except where specified.
7. Only one entry per arranger per class will be allowed. Arrangers from the same household will be permitted to enter individually as long as each creates the design entered. Two may not enter as a team.

8. Infringement of the following rules will result in severe penalty.
 - a. Painted or dyed fresh plant materials, and live creatures are not allowed.
 - b. The use of plant materials on the state or local conservation lists is not permitted.
 - c. The American flag or flag of any country may not be used in an arrangement or as a decoration in any way.
9. There are but two causes for disqualification of an arrangement:
 - a. Roses not outdoor grown.
 - b. Use of artificial plant material.

10 The Orange County Rose Society and Roger's Gardens will take all precautions, but will not be responsible for arrangements or containers. The exhibitor should place their name and number on the container where it cannot be seen by the judges. The arranger shall pick up or arrange to have their entries picked up at the end of the show at 4:00 pm on **Sunday, October 25TH, 2009**
